

Pet Assistance (Compassionate Care) Program

OHS's **Pet Assistance Program** provides basic veterinary services—including spay/neuter, vaccination, deworming, and microchipping or tattooing—to pet owners facing **financial difficulties**. The program ensures that animals can receive care even when their guardians are very low-income. It's entirely funded by community donations and offered through local veterinary partners throughout the Okanagan.

To be eligible, applicants are assessed based on:

- Household income and housing situation
- Availability of donations to the program
- Participation of partner veterinarians in your area

This program is intended for those experiencing financial barriers who otherwise couldn't access basic veterinary care.

How the Program Works

- 1. Submit the **Pet Assistance application form**.
- 2. Indicate if the situation is an **emergency** to request expedited handling.
- 3. You typically receive a response within **2–7 days** with your qualification status and agreed-upon contribution amount.
- 4. Once approved, OHS issues a **case number** and instructions, which you then bring to the **partner veterinary clinic** to book the appointment.
- 5. During the visit, you pay your **partial contribution**. If additional medical issues arise, the vet will request approval from OHS before proceeding.

What is Covered:

Covered services include:

- Spay/neuter surgery
- Vaccinations
- Deworming
 Microchipping or tattooing
- Pain medication if needed.
- Antibiotics
- These services are prioritized to **relieve suffering and improve welfare**, especially in situations deemed urgent or medically necessary

How to Apply

- 1. Visit the Okanagan Humane Society website and access the **Pet Assistance Program** section.
- 2. Fill out and submit the application form, noting if your request is urgent.
- 3. Wait for contact from OHS with your qualification, contribution amount, and partner vet details.
- 4. Follow the guidance to book your appointment.
